

The Newborn Behavioural Observational (NBO) system is a structured set of observations designed to help the clinician and parent together, to observe the infant's behavioural capacities and identify the kind of support the infant needs for his successful growth and development. The NBO system consists of a set of 18 neurobehavioral observations, which describe the newborn's capacities and behavioural adaptation from birth to the third month of life. The NBO provides parents with individualized information about their infant's behaviour, so that they can appreciate their baby's unique

competencies and vulnerabilities and thereby understand and respond to their baby, in a way that meets her/his developmental needs. For more on the NBO see <http://www.brazelton-institute.com/clnbas.html>
